





## News on the Membership Drive...

Normally, the membership application would be in this newsletter but this year it will go out in a special mailing the first week of January. Due to some confusion between the annual appeal campaign and the membership drive we thought it would be best to separate the two by more than a month. The Society is offering Gold and Platinum memberships. 
