

Along with a grape and grape leaf border, it includes our Brick Tavern Museum and Lee School, the Rainbow Falls, Seneca Lake, auto racing, the Townsend Grange, the Burdett train station, the Glen Springs Hotel, Lamoka & Waneta Lakes, and the County Courthouse. An actual sample is at the Museum to view.



#### HISTORICAL PHOTOS


Ruins of the grist-mill erected around 1831 by Dr. Samuel Watkins in the Glen Entrance Amphitheater. In this photo you can see cattle grazing in the foreground. Morvalden Ells purchased and opened the Glen in 1863 for use as a tourist attraction. The old grist-mill was removed in 1869. This photo was probably taken right before its removal.






Below is the view looking out the front door of the

"Bazaar" souvenir shop located at the top of the Watkins Glen park in the late 1800s. Notice the gas lighting?





For more than half a century, commencing in 1860, the familiar caravan of Gypsy Josh (above), his wife, and his family, arrived at this place [Havana] during the spring of the year. The Gypsy king was born in England as Joshua Small, and was known far and wide, having traversed every state of the union. One of his favorite routes passed through the valley of Catharine Creek and beyond. Upon his death, he was buried at Hornellsville, Steuben Co., with his wife and others of his family (text taken from Morrison's Early History of Havana).



An amazing photo, circa 1900, showing the intersection of Fourth and Franklin Streets in Watkins. The light-colored structure on the left is the Jefferson House, built by Dr. Samuel Watkins in 1835 and torn down in 1978. Directly across the street on the right was the Opera House, now Jerlando's Italian Restaurant. In the distance is the spire of the Methodist church, which burnt off in a 1927 fire.


